Kendrick Foundation: A Special Relationship

The Kendrick Foundation, Inc., a supporting organization of the Community Foundation of Morgan County, Inc., was established in 2001 as a vehicle to assist health related programs benefiting residents of Morgan County.

With assets over \$26 Million, the Kendrick Foundation, Inc. exists to contribute grant monies to medical and health programs, provide support to community healthcare outreach programs, provide financial support to hospice programs, provide healthcare education, and provide financial support to programs for the medically indigent.

Kendrick Foundation, Inc. is governed by a six member board of directors who carry the responsibility for the investments, grants and scholarships.

The Community Foundation of Morgan County, Inc. provides professional and technical services to support the operations of the Kendrick Foundation, Inc. In 2005, grants totaling \$405,807 and scholarships totaling \$113,025 were awarded.

Kendrick Foundation, Inc. Scholarships

Each year, the Kendrick Foundation, Inc. awards extensive scholarships to Morgan County students committed to healthcare-related fields of study. These scholarships provide up to \$10,000 per year per student for tuition to an accredited college, university or other educational program.
