On June 5, Community Foundation directors and staff members had the opportunity to attend the Toxic Charity Regional Forum in Scottsburg. The session was one of five offered across the state by the Indiana Philanthropy Alliance. It was well attended by our local nonprofit partners and other regional organizations. Author Robert Lupton spoke about topics within his book Toxic Charity, which focuses on developing human capacity instead of creating dependency.

The Madison Area Arts Alliance was created in 2014 with help from a proactive/strategic grant from the Community Foundation Board of Directors. In the span of two years,






the Arts Alliance has grown with the support of artists and community members. A main focus of the MAAA is to connect artists to each other and to the greater community. Artists have been brought together for networking at roundtable events and connected to area companies looking to purchase art for their offices and buildings.

In March, Madison was named the sixth Arts and Cultural District in the state by the Indiana Arts Commission. The Madison Area Arts Alliance took the lead in creating the application and presentation.

through grants. Through these

of the people of Jefferson
County. The following Flexible
Community Funds were
created in 2015:



Gardner Insurance Agency Community Fund

Gardner Insurance Agency established this Flexible Community Fund to give back to the community they have served since 1979. This community-minded, philanthropic business is committed to their customers and the community they call home, as evidenced by the creation of this new fund.

MainSource Bank Community Fund

MainSource Bank created a Flexible Community Fund to support a community they serve: Jefferson County. At MainSource,



employees are encouraged to strengthen their communities, and be a force for good through volunteer work and financial support. Partnering with the Community Foundation through the establishment of this fund is a reflection of MainSource Bank's values: Integrity, Teamwork, and Excellence.

Vehicle Service Group Employee Endowment Fund

This Flexible Community Fund was established by Vehicle Service Group. The company, which includes long-time Madison manufacturer Rotary Lift, is committed to its hardworking employees and their families. The gifts made by VSG and its employees will grow and provide grants to Jefferson County organizations that are addressing the ever-changing needs and passions of the community.





Field of Interest Funds provide support a donor's particular area of interest. The Community Foundation staff, Grants Committee, and Board of Directors identify projects that elevate and support these specialized interests.

Caring for Veterans Fund

This fund was established by a retired Air Force Chief Master Sergeant and will provide support to Jefferson County veterans' causes. Grants will be given to nonprofit organizations who provide benefits awareness, homeless assistance, mental and physical health education and awareness, Veterans Affairs transportation services, temporary housing, and other services for veterans.

Eleanor T. Birk Foundation Youth Fund

This field of interest fund was created by the Eleanor T. Birk Foundation. The Birk Foundation is a private foundation that has provided support to many Jefferson County nonprofits for over ten years. Grants from this fund will provide support to programs and projects that benefit youth in Jefferson County.



Donor Advised Funds allow donors to recommend the charitable organizations that benefit from the fund's annual distribution. Donor Advised Funds are a cost-effective and efficient alternative to a private or family foundation.

Tony Greco Memorial Fund for the Arts

Paul and Janice Greco established this fund in memory of their son, Tony, who passed away in 2011. Tony was a librarian and journalist by trade, but explored and enjoyed many areas of art including writing, film, and music. Grants from this fund will be used for arts programming and activities in Jefferson County.

John & Maureen Wurtz Charitable Fund



College Hill Cemetery Endowment

The College Hill Cemetery Association, made up of family members of many of the people buried there, created the College Hill Cemetery Endowment. This Designated Fund will provide grants to care for the cemetery forever. The association has plans to deed the cemetery property to the Historic Eleutherian College organization because of its proximity and because it is the final resting place for many of the significant people of the College's history.



First Christian Church Endowment

The members of First Christian Church have established this fund to help support the church's mission of serving Jefferson County. The church will be celebrating its 180th birthday in 2016 and thought that creating this fund would be a great way to commemorate that milestone, encourage additional donations from church members, and create perpetual support for the church in the years to come.



Dr. Gertrude Geraets Memorial Fund for Prince of Peace Catholic Schools

Prince of Peace Catholic Schools created this agency endowment in memory of volunteer Dr. Gertrude Geraets. She was a life-long educator and served as an Education professor at Hanover College. After her retirement in 1989, Dr. Geraets volunteered her time at the Pope John Elementary library and at the Madison-Jefferson County Public Library. Grants from this fund will be used to purchase textbooks and other educational materials for the students and faculty of Prince of Peace Catholic Schools.



Friends of the Madison-Jefferson County Public Library Endowment

This Agency Endowment was created by the Friends of the Jefferson County Public Library of Madison and Hanover. Founded in 1982, the organization collects memberships and hosts an annual used book sale to support the two library branches. This fund will provide financial support to the Friends organization to continue their promotion of the library's services and purchasing of needed equipment.



B.R. & H.L. Alexander Memorial Endowment for H.O.P.P.S.

Created by Margot and Robin Henderson in memory of Margot's parents, this fund will provide operating support to H.O.P.P.S. Inc. H.O.P.P.S. stands for "Helping Our Pediatric Patients Smile", and is an organization that helps pediatric cancer patients and their families. Grants from this Designated Fund will be given to H.O.P.P.S. to support their mission of serving Jefferson County families by assisting with transportation and housing for pediatric cancer patient care.



Jefferson County Veterans Fund

The Jefferson County Veterans Fund was established by Margot and Robin Henderson in honor of WWII Veteran Bernard Roland Alexander, and generations of Henderson servicemen and servicewomen. Grants from this endowment will be made to the Jefferson County Veterans Council, which provides aid and assistance to local veterans.

Barbara Trimble Memorial Fund for Girls Incorporated

Bob Trimble and his family established this designated fund in memory of his wife, Barbara. Barbara was a founding board member of the Community Foundation, and was heavily involved in many organizations in Madison, such as Girls Incorporated. Annual grants from this fund will help Girls Inc. achieve their mission of empowering Jefferson County girls to be "Strong, Smart, and Bold".

Dr. Fred Henderson Family Scholarship Fund

This scholarship fund was established in 1961 at Trinity United Methodist Church in memory of long-time Madison dentist Dr. Fred Henderson. Dr. Henderson's family members have endowed the scholarship to help future recipients reach their education goals.



WOMEN'S GIVING CIRCLE

EMPOWERING WOMEN TO MAKE A DIFFERENCE

Formed in 2012, the Women's Giving Circle of Jefferson County (WGCJC) is a community of philanthropic women of all ages and backgrounds. By combining their financial strength, these women are able to collectively make a positive change for women and children throughout Jefferson County.

Assets of the WGCJC are held and maintained at the Community Foundation through a field of interest pass-through fund and a field of interest endowed fund.

All women in Jefferson County are welcome and invited to join. Membership consists of an annual contribution of \$100, which is tax-deductible. Seventy-five percent of each membership is used to make the annual grants, while twenty-five percent is invested in the WGCJC endowment.

HOW WE GIVE

The WGCJC makes grants annually to organizations that have the greatest potential to help the women and children of Jefferson County. The Grants Sub-Circle reviews applications and provides grant recommendations to the general membership, which then votes on the recommendations at the annual meeting/dinner in March. Grants are focused on the following four fields of interest, with the specific purpose of benefitting women and/or children:

- Education
- Economic Empowerment
- Physical and Mental health
- Violence and Crime



THE GOALS OF THE WGCJC

- Make a significant difference in the community by empowering women to contribute time, talents, and monetary resources to the needs of women, children, and families.
- Educate and increase awareness of the needs of local women, children, and families.
- Provide social opportunities, events, and exposure for women in our community.

Since its creation in 1991, the Community Foundation of Madison and Jefferson County has granted over \$10 million to nonprofit agencies that serve Jefferson County residents. The grants awarded in 2015 totaled \$250,165.

In May, the Community Foundation awarded Historic Madison, Inc. \$50,000 for their capital campaign to restore and renovate the Shrewsbury-Windle House. Following the restoration, the home will be available for use by the public and for touring. "We have been humbled by the unbelievable generosity of our local citizens along with other friends in Indiana and across the country," said HMI President and Executive Director John Staicer in a press release. "We are so grateful for our community's generosity."

"Preserving Jefferson County's past for future generations is important to the Community Foundation", said Carri Dirksen, Community Foundation Board and Grants Committee Chair. "Therefore, we decided to be a significant part of Historic Madison, Inc.'s Capital Campaign to restore the historic Shrewsbury-Windle House National Historic Landmark."

On September 30, the 2015 Fall Grants Cycle Award Reception was held at the Jefferson County Historical Society. For consideration of grant funding, local nonprofit agencies submitted an online application. Selected finalists



were asked to host on-site visits so members of the Foundation's Grants Committee could learn more about the organizations, their projects, and goals. Organizations that received grant funding included:

Canaan Volunteer Fire Department — \$2,600

To install a handicap-accessible ramp into the firehouse so all citizens can enter and participate in community events.

City of Madison Fire Department — \$21,000

To purchase an all-terrain vehicle to be used at county events and equipment for water emergency situations.

City of Madison, Indiana — \$15,000

To develop a comprehensive plan for the City of Madison to be used for the America's Best Communities Competition and other future grant applications.

Girls Inc. of Jefferson Co., Indiana — \$16,000

To improve playground equipment to provide a safe place for the girls to play

Habitat for Humanity - \$5,375

To contribute to a matching grant for a new box truck to transport donations and materials to Habitat for Humanity work sites.

Hanover College Theatre — \$1,900

To upgrade technical elements, such as lighting instruments, at the college's performance venue, The Other Place.

Hanover Police Department — \$12,600

To purchase simulation style training equipment to prepare local law enforcement officers for emergency scenarios that may arise in the line of duty.
