The original Board members were Hugh J. and Jane K. Andersen, and Hugh's sister, Mary Andersen Hulings. They strongly embraced Andersen Family values learned from Fred, Molly, Isabel and Kitty Andersen: giving back to the community, being responsible citizens, and caring for their neighbors. The current board members continue to uphold this commitment, strive to build upon this spirit of philanthropy, and remain strongly supportive of the St. Croix Valley area.

The directors strive to instill in the next generation of Andersen family members the legacies passed on to them by the founders — the value of community and sharing. In 1994 the Next Generation Fund was created as a means for the next generation to learn about all aspects of philanthropy. The Fund does not accept unsolicited requests as the members prefer to search out and fund organizations based upon their current geographic and program interest areas. It is with pride and excitement that the directors watch this generation of Andersen family members work together to develop their focus areas, embrace the values of their ancestors, and make grants.

In 1994, Christine E. Andersen and Sarah J. Andersen each created their own special fund within the Foundation to further promote their charitable interests in the community. Contributions from these Funds are Foundation grants, not individual gifts. The Christine E. Andersen Fund will accept letters of inquiry if the Fund has provided past support. The Sarah J. Andersen Fund does not solicit or accept requests.

GRANT GUIDELINES

The Foundation is particularly interested in programs created, initiated, supported or staffed by the constituency for whom benefits are sought. This type of effort builds upon and further develops individual and community capacities. These programs or projects are internally motivated and organized, not need-based, service-oriented systems brought in and directed by nonconstituents.

The Foundation's primary geographic focus area is the St. Croix Valley: Washington County in Minnesota and Pierce, Polk and St. Croix Counties in Wisconsin. Programs in St. Paul, Minnesota unduplicated in the St. Croix Valley and utilized by St. Croix Valley residents may also be considered.

From time to time the Foundation may consider programs in other parts of the Twin Cities Metropolitan Area and Greater Minnesota. Please contact the Program Officer prior to submitting a proposal to determine if the program might be of interest to the Foundation.

Within the primary geographic focus areas, the Foundation is particularly interested in direct service programs:

- Serving children and youth, especially those that provide personal development activities.
- Providing various social support services to the community at large.
- Providing access to health-related services and information.
- Providing educational opportunities and enrichment to the general community.

The Foundation will only consider the following types of programming/organizations if services are provided in the St. Croix Valley - Washington County in Minnesota and Pierce, Polk and St. Croix Counties in Wisconsin:

- Battered women's shelters.
- Special projects or programming in public schools.
- Programs for developmentally or physically disabled.
- Programs for seniors.
- Public/civic projects and activities.

RESTRICTIONS

Hugh J. Andersen Foundation:

- Awards grants only to qualified charitable organizations that are designated as tax exempt under Internal Revenue Service Code 501(c)(3) and are not classified as private foundations.
- Does not make loans, and does not provide grants or scholarships to individuals.
- Does not provide grants for lobbying activities, fundraising dinners and events, or travel.
- Will generally not consider the following types of organizations and programs for funding:
 - Agencies/Divisions/Councils/Programs that have counterparts in St. Paul or the St. Croix Valley
 - Athletic Teams
 - Business/Economics Education
 - Child Care Centers
 - Civic Action Groups
 - Immigration/Refugee Issues and Programming
 - Independent Media Productions
 - Political/Voter Education
 - Private or Alternative Schools
 - Religious Institutions

In addition, the Foundation:

- Will generally not fund the entire budget for a project, but prefers to be part of an effort that is supported by a number of sources.
- Considers major endowment and capital requests for funding to be a low priority.
- Does not provide funding through fiscal agents.
- Considers letters of inquiry. Letters are reviewed at the board's next meeting and applicants are then notified of the status of their request. If the board determines that the request falls within its guidelines and interests, it will be held for further consideration and a full proposal will be requested from the applicant for review at the following board meeting.
- **Deadlines** for submitting proposals are March 15, June 15, September 15 and November 15. When a deadline occurs on a weekend or holiday, the deadline will be the following working day.
- Proposals must be received in the Foundation's office (**not postmarked**) on or before the deadline date. Hand delivered proposals must be received in the Foundation's office by 5:00 p.m. on the day of the deadline. **Faxed applications will not be considered.**
- Applicants will be notified within 4 weeks of the deadline if their proposal is to be considered by the Foundation's Board of Directors. Final funding decisions will be mailed out within 3 weeks of the board meeting.
- The Board considers requests in February, May, September, and November.

APPLICATION PROCEDURES

The Foundation requires a full proposal when applying for a grant. A full proposal consists of **all** the following:

- **Hugh J. Andersen Foundation Grant Proposal Checklist.**
- **Hugh J. Andersen Foundation Request Cover Form.**
- All other documentation as indicated on the Checklist.

Copies of the Grant Proposal Checklist and Request Cover Form are included in this report. For ease of use, these forms may be replicated using your computer or are downloadable from our website www.srinc.biz/hja/forms.html.

The Foundation *prefers* the use of the Hugh J. Andersen Foundation Request Cover Sheet for a complete proposal, however, the Foundation will accept the Minnesota Common Grant Application Form provided the Foundation's Request Cover Sheet and Grant Proposal Checklist are also included. Requests will be considered only when all materials have been received. In order to treat all applications fairly, the Foundation will adhere strictly to established guidelines. **If your proposal is incomplete**, or is missing the Grant Proposal Checklist, we will request further information which will result in a delay in processing the request.

REQUIREMENTS REPORTING

Reports and Evaluations will be required of all grantees receiving, what the board considers to be, major support. Prior to the release of funds, a grant agreement letter must be signed which sets forth the condition of the grant and reporting requirements. Forms are included with the agreement letter which must be used for the scheduled reports. The Foundation accepts the Minnesota Common Report Form.

YOUR PROPOSAL

The Foundation is conscious of the environment and does not want proposals to be bound or placed in folders or other casings. Therefore, please submit one unbound copy of your proposal and limit the length to 10 pages exclusive of attachments. **PLEASE DO NOT SEND VIDEOS.** If you have a video available, please mention it in your proposal. If we wish to view it, we will request a copy.
