

A LETTER TO OUR DONORS

What does "progress" mean for an organization like the Community Foundation of Northern Colorado? If we measure progress in terms of asset growth, then we have certainly made great strides in recent years. The Foundation's size has more than doubled in a little over two years, and the grants flowing out of the Foundation are growing in equal proportion.

Another sign of progress is the new office building we designed and built to house the Foundation for decades to come. It provides exceptional public meeting space in a location central to the region.

The successful role our Foundation played in responding to Hurricane Katrina is most definitely an achievement we should celebrate. Spurred on by the Bohemian Foundation's matching funds challenge, our community sent \$2 million to the Gulf Coast. The Community Foundation processed thousands of individual donations and then worked with the United Way of Larimer County to distribute those funds to frontline, grass-roots organizations in the affected area. No management or processing fee was charged, and every dollar collected went to the intended purpose. In fact, most of the money was hand-delivered by staff from the Community Foundation and the United Way in two separate trips.

There are many things we should celebrate as signs of progress, and you will read about some of them in this report. However, we believe the greatest measure of achievement we can point to is the Foundation's growing ability to bring people together, encourage collaboration, shepherd new projects and foster positive change. The Foundation's capacity to work quietly behind the scenes to provide excellent service and effective leadership is the ultimate measure of success.

DISCOVERY SCIENCE CENTER ENDOWMENT FUND

Visitors who step inside Discovery Science Center are transported to a one-of-a-kind adventure wonderland.

Families mill around 120 interactive exhibits designed to ignite their curiosity and demystify science. Children excitedly crank handles and push buttons as scientific concepts come to life through various exhibits of motion, color, light and sound. It's fitting that Discovery Science Center's motto is "Have fun. Get smarter."

"We give everyone the confidence not only to experience science, but also to explore the world," said Executive Director Annette Geiselman.

Established in 1989 as a grassroots, volunteer organization, the Center has since become a cultural community icon, offering educational programs and events such as planetarium shows and overnight camp-ins. It is Northern Colorado's only hands-on science and technology center, and serves the entire Front Range, with more than 35,000 people visiting each year.

Thanks to the generosity of Poudre School District, Discovery Science Center has been able to grow in the former Barton Elementary School at 703 East Prospect Road. But Geiselman is leading the campaign to build the Center's new downtown home, which it will share with the Fort Collins Museum.

To help with this endeavor, Discovery Science Center recently established an agency endowment fund with the Community Foundation that will ensure it becomes a self-sustaining organization. Geiselman envisions an annual operating budget that is 20 percent endowment funding, 50 percent admission fees, and 30 percent annual gifts.

Gifts of \$1 million from Doug and Jill Schatz and \$1.5 million from the Bohemian Foundation have served as a catalyst for the \$7 million capital funding campaign now underway. Wisely, the Discovery Science Center's board of directors has included an endowment goal of \$2.5 million as an element of the campaign. A \$100,000 challenge grant from the Community Foundation and a \$250,000 gift from the Rainsberger Family have helped encourage gifts to build this endowment.

JABAILY COMMUNITY SERVICE SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Dr. Joe Jabaily was a beloved Loveland resident, known for being a positive, compassionate community leader and volunteer.

He died in July 2004 after a car collided with him while he was racing his bicycle in a triathlon. His friends and family decided to keep his memory alive with an endowed scholarship for local high school seniors that honors Jabaily's passion for access to higher education.

When Linny and Elmo Frickman contacted the Community Foundation, they were surprised to learn they could establish the scholarship fund so quickly. The day they met with Executive Director Ray Caraway, he told them, "You can do this right now."

The Jabaily Community Service Scholarship Fund was established in the fall of 2004. A kick-off fundraiser at the Frickmans' Loveland home raised more than \$25,000. The event, hosted by the Frickmans, Andy and Pam Howard, and Bret Nye, drew more than 100 people, which also reflects the unusually large number of individual donors who have contributed to the fund.


The students were selected from more than 80 applicants by an advisory board composed of the Frickmans; the Howards; Dr. Joe Jabaily's wife, Leslie Jabaily; and their children Lisa, Nicole, Matt, and Buck.

The award ceremony and fundraiser in April 2005 raised more than \$8,000 to increase the endowment. It was a joyful and moving event that honored Jabaily's generous human qualities and his deep commitment to community and public service.

"We are proud to honor Dr. Joe Jabaily by supporting students who will make a difference in our nation's future," the Frickmans said. "Students committed to peace, human rights, and protecting the environment."

Jabaily Scholarship recipient Lee Sullivan is a freshman at the University of Colorado, Boulder. He plans to become an Outward Bound instructor, and hopes to run for elected office one day.

FIRST NATIONAL BANK OF ESTES PARK FUND

First National Bank of Estes Park has been serving the Estes Valley since 1965, growing alongside a town famous for its magnificent vistas of Rocky Mountain National Park.

The bank has played a vital role in the community's growth and prosperity, and has long given donations to worthy causes.

"We're kind of a quiet donor," said David G. Taylor, the bank's president and CEO. "We're a locally-owned community bank, and part of our mission is to serve the community. That's what banks do."

But it recently improved its method of charitable giving with the help of the Community Foundation. Because the value of the bank's investment portfolio increased significantly over the years, Taylor and the board of directors decided on a better way to give back to the community while receiving tax benefits.

Since the fall of 2004, the First National Bank of Estes Park Fund, a donor advised fund of the Community Foundation, has been awarding grants to the Town of Estes Park and local nonprofit agencies such as Boys Scouts of America-Longs Peak Council, Caring Pregnancy Center of Estes Valley, and Cultural Arts Council of Estes Park.

"Instead of me writing a check from the bank, which would be an expense, I request the Community Foundation to make a grant from the bank's donor advised fund," Taylor said. "It's a win-win situation for making charitable donations."

The bank receives many grant requests throughout the year, and Taylor appreciates being able to fax a simple one-page form to the Community Foundation whenever he wants to recommend a grant.

"It makes the whole process very, very simple for me," he said. "It just works well."

"If businesses knew they could use the Community Foundation to make charitable donations to the organizations and causes they care about, I know they'd want to establish a fund," said Taylor, who is glad to talk with business owners interested in working with the Community Foundation. "It's just amazing."

FICKEL-MCCARTY FOUNDATION OF BERTHOUD

Talk with anyone about the Town of Berthoud and it's not long before the name Fickel comes up.

Long-time residents Drs. Bruce "Doc" and Helen Fickel, who recently celebrated their 63rd wedding anniversary, have devoted their lives to supporting many of the projects and organizations that make Berthoud a better place.

It's why they received the Founders' Award at the Community Foundation's annual luncheon in May.

"Helen says, 'Giving to others is the way we pay rent for taking up space on God's earth,' "Doc Fickel said with a laugh.

Through their donor advised fund, the Fickel-McCarty Foundation of Berthoud, they have given many grants to local nonprofit organizations, including five permanent, annual grants that go to Berthoud Community Library, House of Neighborly Service, Salvation Army, American Red Cross, and United Way of Larimer County.

"Those five grants will always be in existence," said Helen Fickel, who takes comfort knowing the Community Foundation will carry out her and her husband's wishes long after their lifetimes. "It allows us to do exactly what we want."

"What I like about having a fund with the Community Foundation is it's a way to distribute money with the 'spendable' portion, and still preserve the principal," Doc Fickel said.



Philanthropy has always been a part of their lives, and the Fickels have funded such notable projects as the library, the Little Thompson Valley Pioneer Museum, and Fickel Park.

"They passionately believe that charitable giving cannot be overdone. COMMUNITY GIVING GROUPS

Giving groups are composed of community-minded people who pool their charitable dollars in a common fund, with the idea that giving is more enjoyable and has a greater impact when people work together.

Members of the Community Foundation's giving groups enhance their understanding of philanthropy and their appreciation for the valuable work of local nonprofits. They review grant requests submitted each fall, and award grants to nonprofits from their endowment funds. Members also attend social gatherings.

Fort Collins Forever, Loveland Generations and Berthoud's Bequest consists of individuals and couples who donate a minimum of \$500 per year. Estes Legacy Leaders allows participation at a variety of levels and does not require a minimum donation.

Because the Community Foundation of Northern Colorado is a tax-exempt public charity, these donations are tax-deductible.

FORT COLLINS FOREVER

Fort Collins Forever celebrated its seventh year in 2005. The Fort Collins Forever Fund was established in 1998 by a group of dedicated community members wishing to contribute to the future of youth in Fort Collins; they have since expanded their focus.

The fund surpassed its endowment goal of \$200,000 and is now valued at \$265,000. The group distributed \$20,000 in grants during fall 2004 to such nonprofits as Canyon Concert Ballet, CSU/Human Animal Bond in Colorado, Wingshadow, and the Women's Resource Center.

Fort Collins Forever and Odell Brewing Company hosted a special event in April, where members were treated to samples of Odell's renowned master recipes. Ralph Sharon, Tony Bennett's accompanist and music director for almost four decades, played the piano for members and their guests during an unforgettable evening.

LOVELAND GENERATIONS

Loveland Generations has awarded nearly \$40,000 in grants to the community since its inception in 2001. The Loveland Generations Fund is valued at more than \$50,000 and membership continues to grow under the leadership of Nanci Garnand, who chairs the steering committee.

This group of community-minded citizens supports organizations serving youth, adults and seniors in Loveland. Recent grant recipients from the Loveland Generations Fund include Boys and Girls Club of Larimer County, Hospice of Larimer County, Junior Achievement, Partners of Larimer County, and The Tutor Center.

One of the group's social gatherings was hosted by sculptor George Lundeen at his studio in May. The artist gave a sneak peak of his bronze masterpiece, *The Player*, to members and guests of Loveland Generations during a baseball-themed gathering. The statue was later unveiled at its permanent site, the entrance to Coors Field in Denver, home of the Colorado Rockies. Bruce and Muriel Hach recently hosted another gathering for Loveland Generations in their beautiful home.

Thanks to members' generosity and enthusiasm, the fund is valued at more than \$26,000; recent plans included awarding a scholarship of \$1,000, in addition to several grants.

The group has 30 members and continues to grow, setting the pace for all the community giving groups.

GIVING OPTIONS

Working with the Community Foundation can provide great benefits that are not available to donors who create their own private foundation.

A **donor advised** fund with the Community Foundation can be established simply by signing a brief fund agreement. Donors have the flexibility to advise the Community Foundation as to which nonprofits will benefit from a fund and in what amounts. The ability to advise the Foundation is ongoing, and the donor can name successor advisors.

A **supporting organization** established in partnership with the Community Foundation provides the donor with the independence of a separate legal entity and a separate board, but with the advantages of "public charity" status. The supporting organization can also take advantage of the administrative support and investment services already in place at the Community Foundation.

Our Funds

DONOR ADVISED FUNDS

Donor Advised Funds offer a simple, efficient alternative to the creation of a family or corporate foundation. They combine convenience, flexibility and value with the expertise of a full-time, professional staff to make your charitable giving easy, effective and enjoyable. You can create a donor advised fund with a minimum contribution of \$10,000 and then advise the Community Foundation as frequently as you choose as to the grants you would like to distribute from your fund. You may elect to hand-deliver grant checks from your fund, or the Community Foundation can mail grant checks to the recipients with a letter informing them that the grant is from your fund at the Community Foundation. The Community Foundation staff is available to liquidate property or other non-cash gifts you wish to make to your fund. And the staff is also available to work with you to screen grant requests, schedule site visits to selected nonprofits and provide information on giving opportunities. You may name your children and grandchildren as successor advisors for the fund, and your fund can be a beneficiary of your will, a gift annuity or a charitable remainder trust.




